



MY EXPERIENCE: THE BENEFITS OF ART THERAPY AT ST. VINCENT HOSPICE

A few months after our young adult son died, I was privileged to participate in the art therapy program provided by St.Vincent Hospice. I felt intimidated at first, meeting alone with an artist and therapist in a room which held only a blank wall where I'd do my work, but simultaneously relieved that I didn't have to come up with the right words to describe the indescribable.

Week after week, I faced my memories, disappointments, angers, despair, loneliness, fears, and questions as I faced a fresh sheet of paper. My tools were an array of pastel crayons, acrylic paints and the compulsion to work out my pain on art paper.

St. Vincent Hospice provided all the materials and the care of a uniquely talented art therapist. Physically, pushing the pastel across paper, layering paint, wiping my hands of my messiness, I truly experienced and worked through many of the aspects of my grief.

Visually, my amateur efforts rewarded, confirmed and reminded me of what I was reconciling. I'm a better person for the opportunity, having learned not just how to get along without my child, but more of who I am and can be now.

CATHY FORD WALKING AGAIN IN 2013 – AS A SURVIVOR

Last year, Cathy Ford and her husband had big plans for celebrating Cathy's 60th birthday. What they didn't plan on was cancer. Because Cathy was diligent about yearly mammograms, her breast cancer was caught at stage one.

Cathy sat down for her first treatment on their 32nd wedding anniversary. While it wasn't the best anniversary they remembered, they were just happy to be together.

Cathy's husband Joe, her biggest advocate, brought all of Cathy's supporters together to form Team Cathy at the 2012 St.Vincent Cancer Walk and surprise her. It was also Cathy's 60th birthday. They're ready to defend their team title and raise money for others again in 2013, thankful for the care Cathy received so that her birthday this year is cancer free!

"Everyone I have met here at the hospital from technicians, receptionists, nurses to doctors— have all taken such good care of me," said Cathy. "It's a wonderful feeling to know that the money raised through this Walk will



give hope to other cancer patients being treated at St.Vincent."

THE VALUE OF A BASELINE NEUROCOGNITIVE TEST

Andrew is a 17 year old junior in high school who loves to play football - but midseason he suffered a mild traumatic brain injury (concussion) from a head to head collision with another player.

Fortunately, his Sports Medicine team had him do a preseason baseline neurocognitive test (ImPACT) that his Sports Medicine physician used in decision making for a safe return to play. Andrews's baseline test turned out to be very valuable. His symptoms resolved quickly but neurocognitive testing done when he felt fine showed residual deficits in multiple areas.

Follow up testing a few days later showed that all testing returned to normal and Andrew returned to sport safely. Had the valid baseline not been available, Andrew may have been released to play football too soon, putting him at significant risk for additional injury or another concussion and possibly long term neurocognitive problems.

Baseline neurocognitive testing is a valuable tool to physicians who make critical decisions about timing of return to play in sports. Traumatic brain injury caused by sport related concussions is a silent epidemic affecting more than 1 million students each year.

You did it! A new, expanded Women's Clinic at the St. Vincent Joshua Max Simon Primary Care Center is now open and serving thousands of underserved and uninsured women each month in our community.

A Blessing Ceremony was held and attended by many donors on February 8 to officially open the space. Words of deep appreciation for the generosity of the local community were expressed, noting that the entire \$1 million project was funded through philanthropic support.

The larger space will alleviate issues created by rapidly increasing patient volumes at the Women's Clinic.

The new space

increases the Clinic's capacity by nearly **30-percent**, and it is anticipated that the move will allow the Clinic to provide pregnancy care to more than 1,000 additional expectant mothers per year.

A few short hours later, the Pediatric Critical Care Transport Team arrived at Daviess Community Hospital in Washington, Indiana, stabilized Hayden and transported him to Indianapolis for emergency heart care. Today, Hayden enjoys his favorite pastimes: showing his pet goats, taking ukulele lessons and helping his dad package pizzas at the family business.
