This holiday season, we're excited to share more of your good work.

Evie is one example.

Kate, Evie's mom, learned during her final ultrasound that Evie would need extra care from the moment she was born. She had a diaphragmatic hernia which caused improper growth of her lungs, and it meant her tiny organs had moved to the wrong places inside her body.

"Nothing can prepare you for news like this."

Through Evie's five month stay in the hospital, one thing was clear — **people like you were there every step of her journey.**

Her care team of physicians and nurses were able to train on the complex procedure she needed at the William K. Nasser, MD, Healthcare Education and Simulation Center.

She was in the PICU for five months, but the NicView cameras funded by donors made it possible for Evie's parents to see her when they couldn't be by her side.

Every day in the hospital, Evie's parents read books to her provided by the Child Life team.

were provided to women from underserved populations this year through the Ascension St. Vincent Mobile Mammography Unit. This unit partners with local organizations to provide free screening mammograms to women who cannot otherwise afford these potentially life-saving services.

at the Ascension St. Vincent Stress Center Dual Diagnosis Unit. **This unit was created through donor support and is the only hospital-based service of this type in Indiana!**

With help from donor support, a non-clinical access worker connects with local at-risk neighborhoods to build relationships, execute educational activities, and serve as a liaison for mothers' health needs. The Healing Arts Program uses art, movement, music and pet therapy as tools for healing. It is proven to aid in healing, reduce need for pain medications, and can contribute to shortened hospital stays as well as enhance a sense of self control and empowerment over illness.

It's been especially important through the COVID-19 pandemic.

One way the Healing Arts team responded to new needs during the pandemic is by creating the Legacy Print Protocol. It's available when family members or loved ones can't be present during a patient's final moments. With permission, a physical print of a patient's thumb is made. The prints are scanned, edited and then shared with the family. **It's an incredible gift and it's only possible because of donor support.** This year, donor support has given this special gift to 16 families.

The fight of her life: Amy Traub depends on donors for cancer and heart care.

In 2009, Amy Traub received the life-altering diagnosis of endometrial cancer. Since her original diagnosis, Amy has had additional cancer diagnoses including cancerous lesions in her leg and lung, and has endured numerous appointments, surgeries, radiation and chemotherapy—and that's only for the treatment of cancer. Amy also experienced heart issues during this time, which led to multiple stents and open heart surgery.

In her eleven year fight, two things have remained constant for Amy—her support system in her family, her friend, Cynthia, and furbaby, Wyatt, as well as her drive to fight and advocate for herself.
